In EYFS should already have learned:


- that the village I live in is called Hemingbrough, which is in England, which is in the UK and the UK is in the continent of Europe

Nairobi




The city of Nairobi is fondly referred to as the green city under the sun. This is Kenya's capital and the most populous city in the country. It has a population of 4.4 million people.

This city has grown extensively and is one of the cities in Africa that has business and creative spaces in the same space. Nairobi City is home to thousands of Kenyan businesses and over 100 major international companies and organizations. There are old charming buildings blending well with new towering skyscrapers. Just outside of the city, there is an expanse of wild land where many large animals still roam.

Kenya has a **tropical** climate along the coast and an **arid** climate in the highlands. In Nairobi, the summers are short, warm, and overcast and the winters are short, cool, dry, and partly cloudy.

Hemingbrough



Hemingbrough is a small village with a population of just over 2000 people. There are some shops and a school, but not many big business buildings. People live in houses and drive cars but sometimes have to drive a long way for certain products and services.

In Hemingbrough, England, the spring and summer is warm and sunny, but in the Autumn, it starts to get cold and windy with more rain. In winter, it gets very cold and sometimes snows and hailstorms.

There is lots of natural landscape around the village of Hemingbrough, offering areas for walkers, cyclists and people who enjoy nature.
