By the end of the theme I should be able to:

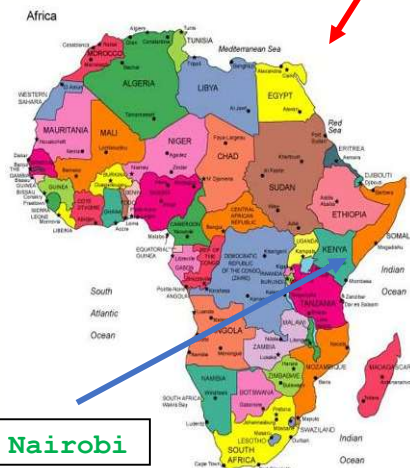
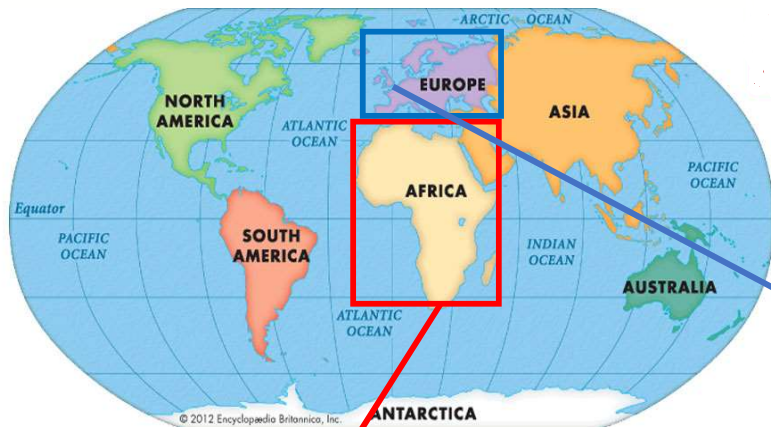
- Name and locate the world's seven continents and five oceans, locating Nairobi and Hemingbrough, describing similarities and differences.

3. Can you describe the physical and human features of both Hemingbrough and Nairobi?

	Hemingbrough	Nairobi
Human features	People live in houses, cottages and farms. There are: two churches, a small park, a post office, a small supermarket, a block of flats, many farms, a pub.	People live in houses / apartments and tourists visit. There are: sky-scrapers, parks, museums, hotels, an airport, shopping centres, supermarkets and a railway station.

5. What is it like to live in Nairobi and how is it different to Hemingbrough?

The city of Nairobi is Kenya's capital. It has a population of 4.4 million people. Nairobi City is home to thousands of Kenyan businesses and over 100 major international companies and organizations. There are old charming buildings with new towering skyscrapers. Just outside of the city, there is an expanse of wild land where many large, wild animals still roam. Kenya has a **tropical** climate along the coast and an **arid** climate in the highlands. In Nairobi, the summers are short, warm, and overcast and the winters are short, cool, dry, and partly cloudy.

Hemingbrough is a small village with a population of just over 2000 people. There are some shops and a school, but not many big business buildings. People live in houses and drive cars but sometimes have to drive a long way for certain products and services. In Hemingbrough, England, the spring and summer is warm and sunny, but in the Autumn, it starts to get cold and windy with more rain. In winter, it gets very cold and sometimes snows and hailstorms. There is lots of natural landscape around the village of Hemingbrough.
